SECTION 1 – FLORAL ART

Highest Points in Open Section: The Marie Adams Trophy.

Natural plant material is any vegetable matter. It includes fresh, dried, garden, wild or made-up plant material, flowers foliage, fruit, vegetable and seaweed.

- Class 1. "DIAMOND BRIGHT" – An exhibit, 50cm x 50cm.
Height unrestricted, accessories allowed.
- Class 2. "LONDON CALLING" – An exhibit, 50cm x 50cm.
Height unrestricted, accessories allowed.
- Class 3. "DAYS OF WINE AND ROSES" – An exhibit, 50cm x 50cm.
Height unrestricted, accessories allowed.
- Class 4. "WE'RE HAVING A PARTY" – Petite exhibit not to exceed 25cm overall, accessories allowed.

Highest Points in Novice Section: The Brenbridge Trophy.

A competitor may win three 1st prizes in a novice class before becoming ineligible for the novice class.

- Class 5. "BRIGHT AND BOLD" – An exhibit, 50cm x 50cm.
Height unrestricted, accessories allowed.
- Class 6. "JOINT EFFORT" – An exhibit 50cm x 50cm.
Height unrestricted, accessories allowed.
- Class 7. "DINNER BY CANDLELIGHT" – An exhibit 50cm x 50cm.
Suitable for a dinner table to incorporate a candle.
Height unrestricted, accessories allowed.
- Class 8. "HAPPY ANNIVERSARY" – A petite exhibit not to exceed 25cm overall, accessories allowed.

SECTION 2 – JUNIOR FLORAL ART

Age Under 10

Highest Points: The Marden Developments Shield.

- Class 9. "MY OLD MAN'S A DUSTMAN" – An exhibit 30cm x 30cm.
Height unrestricted, to incorporate flowers and/or greenery.
Artificial material and accessories permitted.
- Class 10. "MY FAVOURITE CUPCAKE" – An exhibit 30cm x 30cm.
Height unrestricted, to resemble a cupcake using flowers and/or greenery. Artificial material and accessories permitted.

Age 10 - 14

Highest Points: The Nugent Damp Proofing Shield.

- Class 11. "PIRATES OF THE CARIBBEAN" – An exhibit 30cm x 30cm.
Height unrestricted, to incorporate flowers and/or greenery.
Artificial material and accessories permitted.
- Class 12. "BOX OF DELIGHTS" – An exhibit 30cm x 30cm.
Height unrestricted, to incorporate flowers and/or greenery.
Artificial material and accessories permitted.

SECTION 3 – ROSES

Highest Points: The Dr Kelly Challenge Cup.

- Class 13. Hybrid Tea - 1 bloom.
- Class 14. Hybrid Tea - 3 blooms in 1 or more varieties.
- Class 15. Floribunda - 1 stem.
- Class 16. Miniature rose - 1 stem.

SECTION 4 – SWEET PEA

Highest Points: The Sweet Pea Challenge Cup.

- Class 17. Sweet pea - 1 variety, 1 vase, 9 sprays.
- Class 18. Sweet pea - Mixed varieties, 1 vase, 9 sprays.
- Class 19. Sweet pea - 2 varieties, 2 vases, 5 sprays in each.

SECTION 5 – DAHLIA

Highest Points: The Magowan Challenge Cup.

Please note size limits and measure before show to ensure compliance.

- Large – over 200mm (8")
- Medium – 150 – 200mm (6" - 8")
- Small – 110 – 150mm (4 ¾" - 6")
- Pom Pom – must not exceed 50mm (2")

- Class 20. One large dahlia.
- Class 21. Three medium dahlias.
- Class 22. Three small dahlias.
- Class 23. Five pom pom dahlias.
- Class 24. Three blooms of medium cactus or semi cactus dahlia.

SECTION 6 – CUT FLOWERS

- Class 57. Five tomatoes.
- Class 58. Seven cherry tomatoes.

- Class 62. Five of any other fruit not listed above.
